Candidate Statement

Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions, we have been unable to arrange a Green Party presence at social and environmental justice protests, but in the coming months this opportunity may arise. However, I have demonstrated over my term as co-chair my passion for getting young people into politics.

Under my joint leadership over the next year, the Under 18 Greens would collaborate with the Young Greens and other liberation groups to organise a Green Party presence at marches. This way, we can start to attract media attention, and gather support among activists and young people passionate about a range of Green issues: from tackling poverty to anti-racism.

Under 18s in particular are a largely 'untapped market' of future voters. Climate strikers should all be Green supporters, and yet most of them are not. All of those strikers will be potential voters at the next general or local election, and we need to make sure they join us. We must spend time with under 18s, rather than ignoring them as many parties continue to do. With my successful record, I think I am the best candidate to take on this challenge.
